Coding System for Reference:

No Opportunity (NO): Child was not given 5 seconds to respond. Similar to no opportunity in DPICS, if the parent asks a question or gives a command before 5 seconds is up, it's no opportunity (they're allowed to have other neutral statements within 5 seconds).

Verbal Response (VR): Child responded verbally and was loud enough to understand. Note: whisper is considered VR if comprehensible.

Barely Audible Response (BA): Child responded with some sound, but in a voice inaudible to understand.

Nonverbal Response (NV): Child responded with pointing, nodding, gesturing, shrugging shoulders, or mouthing, or vocalizations that are not verbalizations, i.e., sounds but not words.

No Response (NR): Child did not respond either verbally or nonverbally.

Spontaneous Speech (SS): Anything that the child says that is not a response to a question is considered spontaneous speech. For example, if the parent asks "What's your favorite color?" and the child says "Blue. Blue is the prettiest colour ever." – this would be coded as a response **and** spontaneous speech. Or if the child says anything outside of a question sequence. Use the same guidelines you would for DPICS as to what is a separate tally vs. the same tally.

Labelled Praise (LP): Tally all labelled praise that the parent gives. These can be any labelled praise, not just for speaking, e.g., Good sharing; That's a really pretty picture.
